






OVERVIEW


The Hall is a 16,800 square foot industrial venue in East End/ EADO Houston, offering a blank canvas for immersive events that demand height, flexibility, and the ability to transform space at scale.

Located within the Ironworks campus, a site listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the venue benefits from built-in foot traffic, surrounding amenities, and established cultural relevance.

LOCATION

The Hall is located in East End/EADO Houston- a growing cultural hub for major city wide events and currently preparing for increased tourism and programming from the 2026 FIFA World Cup.

The venue is located at the Ironworks Campus and sits alongside its sister building- the Ironworks Marketplace.



HISTORY

A National Register of Historic Places site, the Ironworks campus shaped Houston's industrial history, supported World War II efforts, and pioneered innovations in oilfield safety worldwide.



Built in the 1930s as the headquarters of Cameron Iron Works, our building played a key role in shaping Houston's industrial legacy.


It was here that Cameron Iron Works **developed the first blowout preventer**, a breakthrough that transformed oilfield safety and later earned recognition as a Historic Mechanical Engineering Landmark.

During World War II, Cameron Iron Works supported U.S. manufacturing efforts, becoming a direct supplier to the military and receiving the **Navy's Excellence in Production Award**, an honor reserved for only 5% of the estimated war plants in the nation


Now listed on the **National Register of Historic Places**, the Hall at Ironworks carries the story of Houston hands, ambition, and innovation across generations.

By the 1990s, Cameron Iron Works had been acquired, and the building fell into quiet dormancy. In 2020, after years of inactivity, the Ironworks campus was restored, honoring its historic legacy while adapting it for modern events.







A fully operational crane built to suspend large-scale installations.
